(Sample of 408 households which indicated their age range)

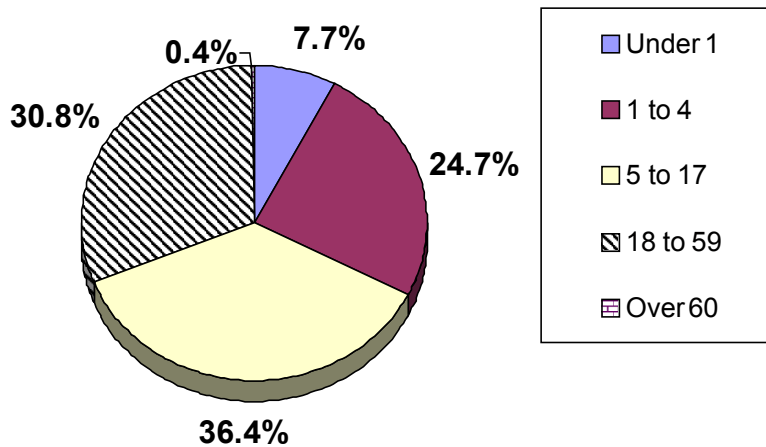


Figure 2: Governorate Most Recently Displaced From, from Household Surveys

(Sample of 408 households which indicated the governorate from which they were most recently displaced)

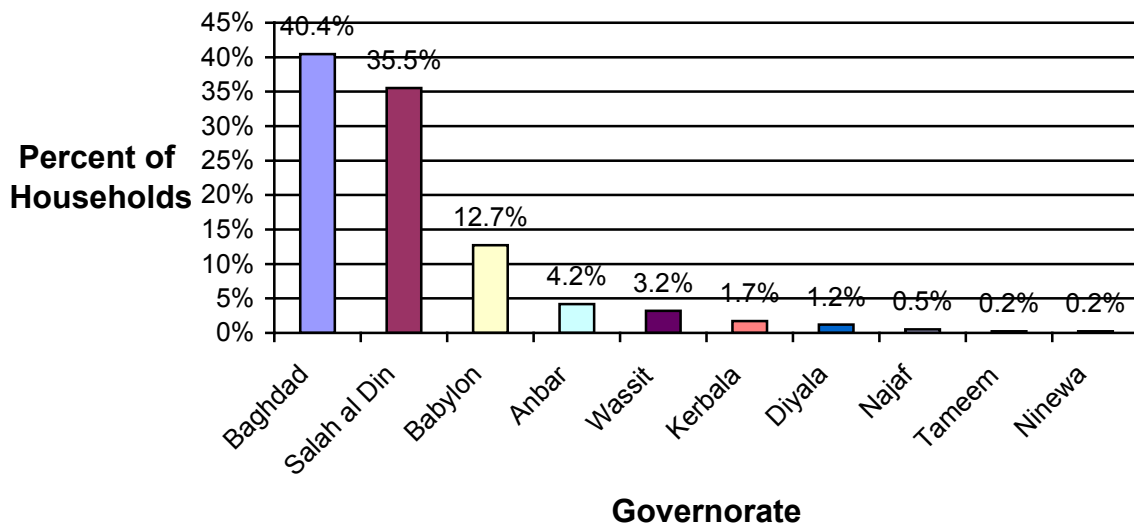


Figure 3: Reasons for Leaving Place of Residence, based on Household Surveys

(Sample of 284 households which indicated their reason for leaving their former place of residence. The values do not add up to 100% because households listed up to three reasons for leaving.)

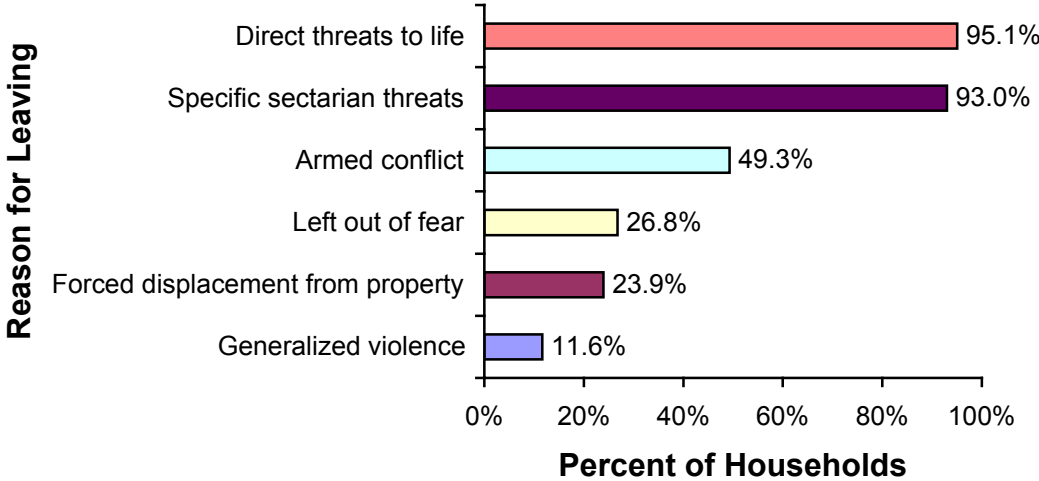


Figure 4: Targeting of Family, from Household Surveys

(Sample of 251 households which indicated whether they thought they were targeted)

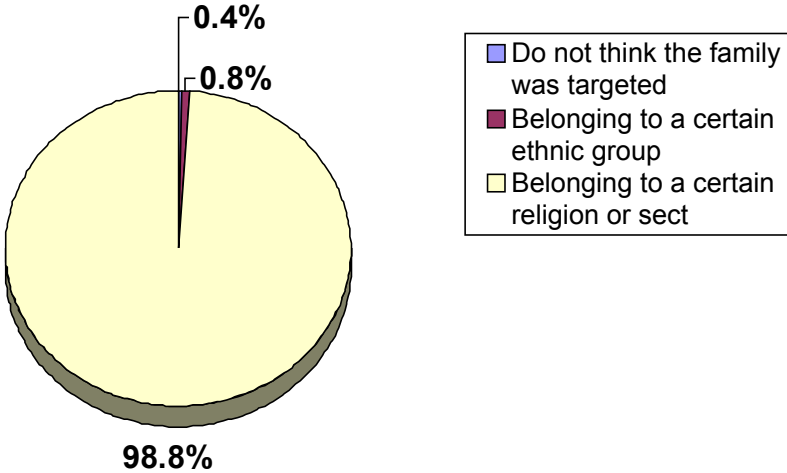


Figure 5: Type of Accommodation, from Household Surveys

(Sample of 406 households which indicated their housing type)

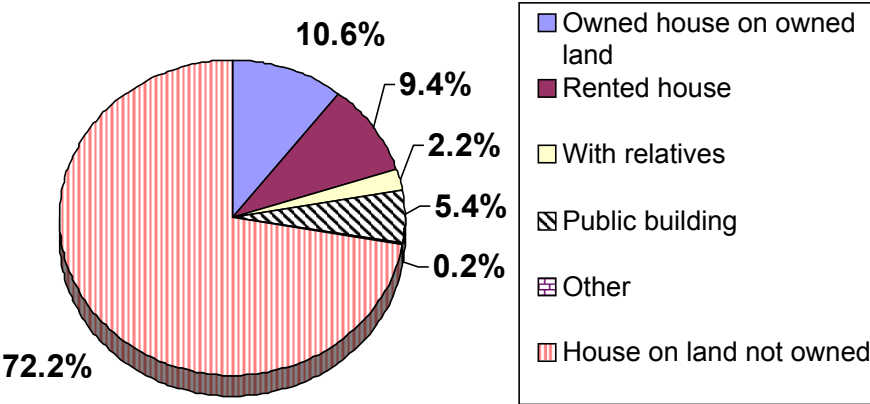


Figure 6: Degree of Crowding in Housing, from Household Surveys

(Sample of 408 households which indicated the degree of crowding in their housing)

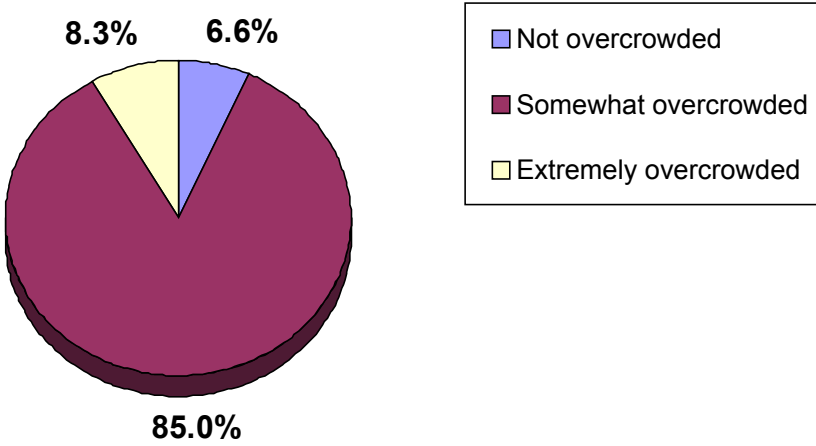


Figure 7: Housing Location, from Household Surveys

(Sample of 404 households which indicated their housing location)

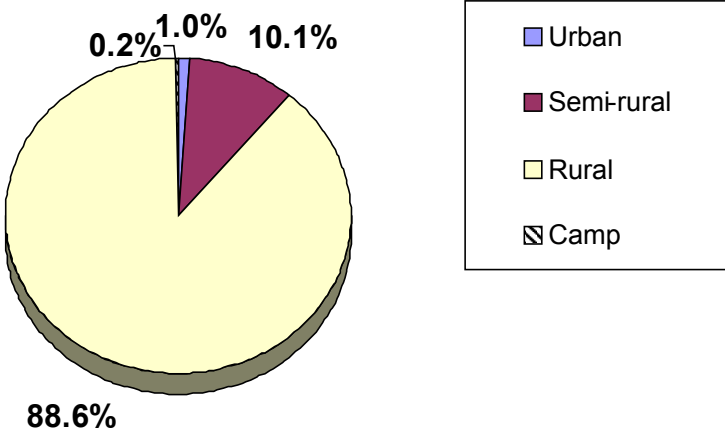


Figure 8: Does the family currently face a threat of eviction or pressure to leave?

(Sample of 229 households which indicated whether they faced a threat of eviction or pressure to leave)

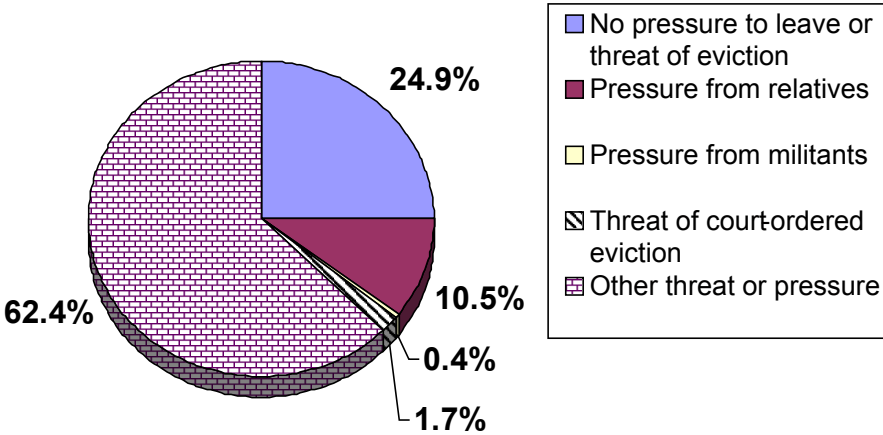


Figure 9: Main Water Sources, based on Household Surveys

(Sample of 283 households which indicated their main water sources. The values do not add up to 100% because households listed up to three water sources.)

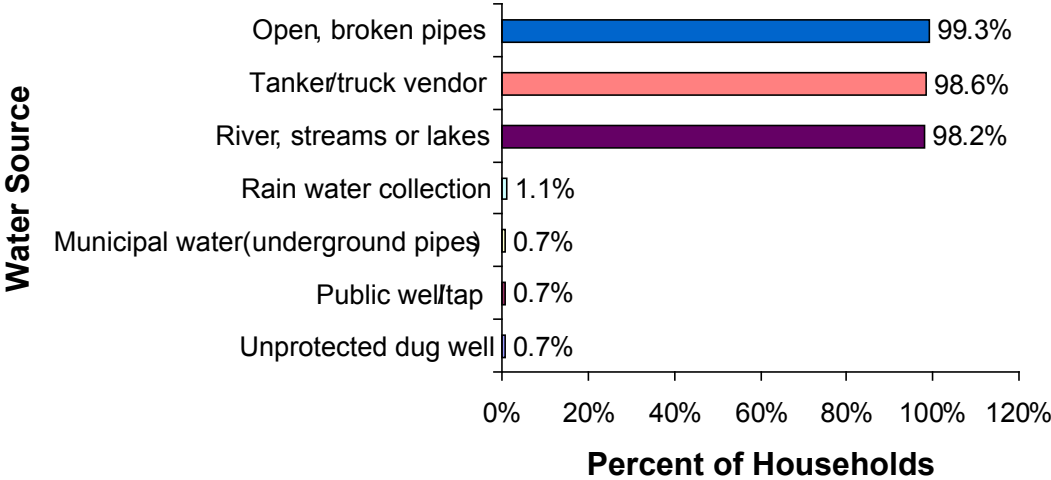


Figure 10: Sewage System, from Household Surveys

(Sample of 4 households which indicated whether they had a sewage system)

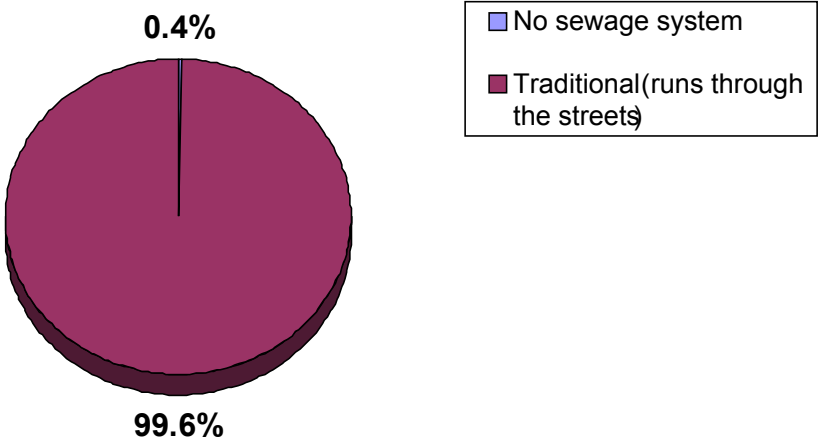


Figure 11: Access to Primary Health Centre in Village, from Household Surveys

(Sample of 281 households which indicated whether they had access to a primary health centre in their village)

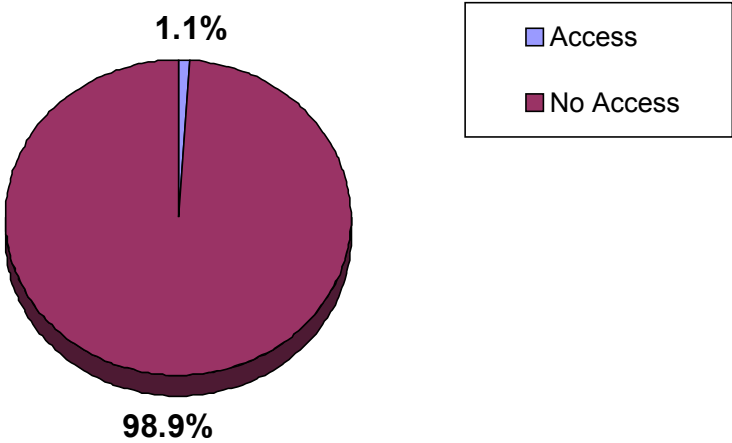


Figure 12: Main Health Problems of Family, from Household Surveys

(Sample of 282 households which indicated their main health problems)

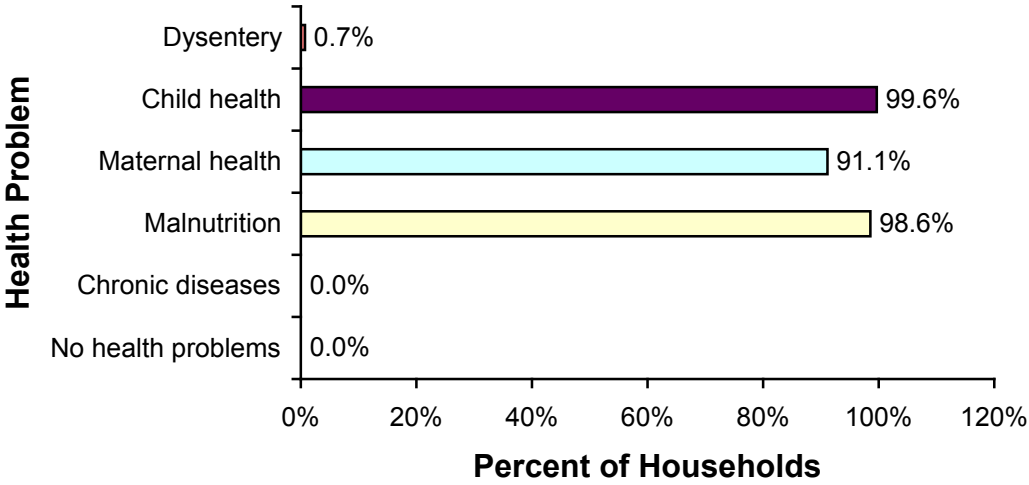


Figure 13: Reasons for Not Attending School, from Household Surveys

(Sample of 169 households which gave reasons for not attending school)

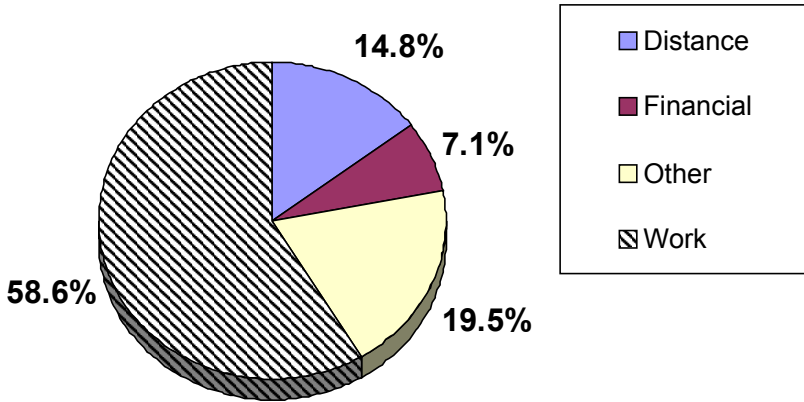


Figure 14: Access to Education Facilities in Village, from Household Surveys

(Sample of 11 households which indicated whether they had access to education facilities in their village)

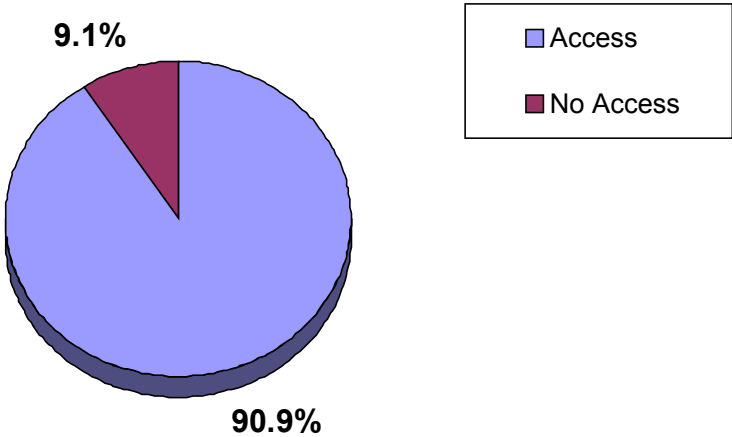


Figure 15: Problems in Registering for Schools Because of Lack of Documentation, from Household Surveys

(Sample of 40 households which indicated whether they had problems registering for schools because of lack of documentation)

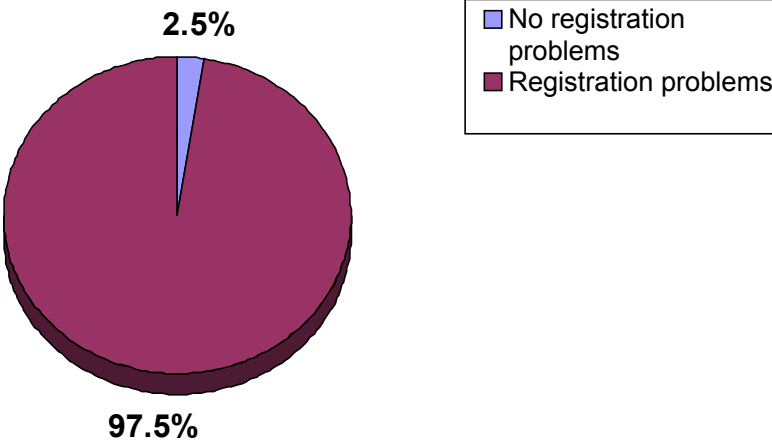


Figure 16: Accessible Fuels, from Household Surveys

(Sample of 284 households which indicated whether they had access to fuels)

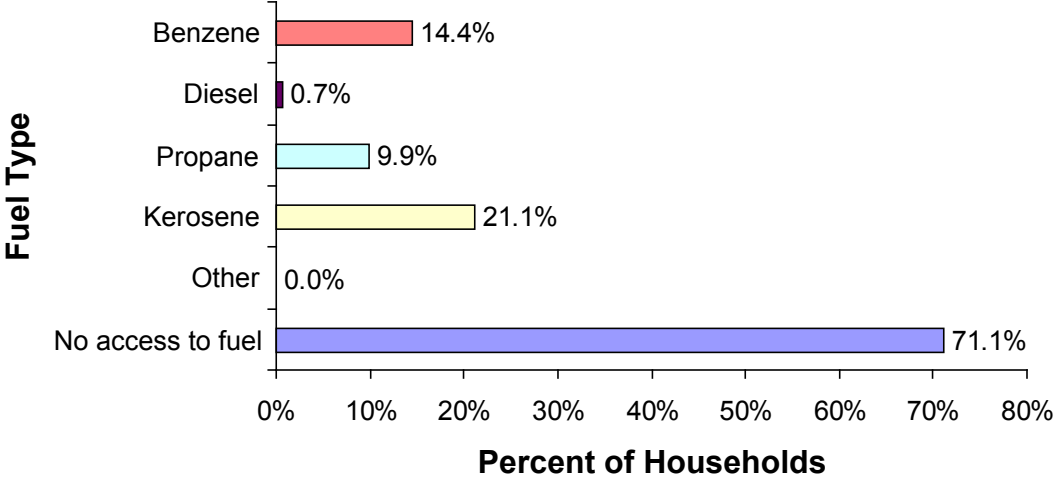


Figure 17: Access to Electricity, from Household Surveys

(Sample of 284 households which indicated their access to electricity)

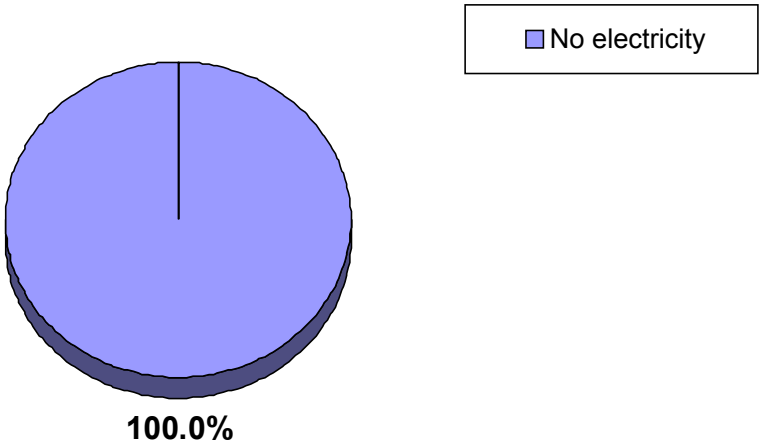


Figure 18: Special Needs of Returnee/IDP Households, based on Household Surveys

(Sample of 408 households)

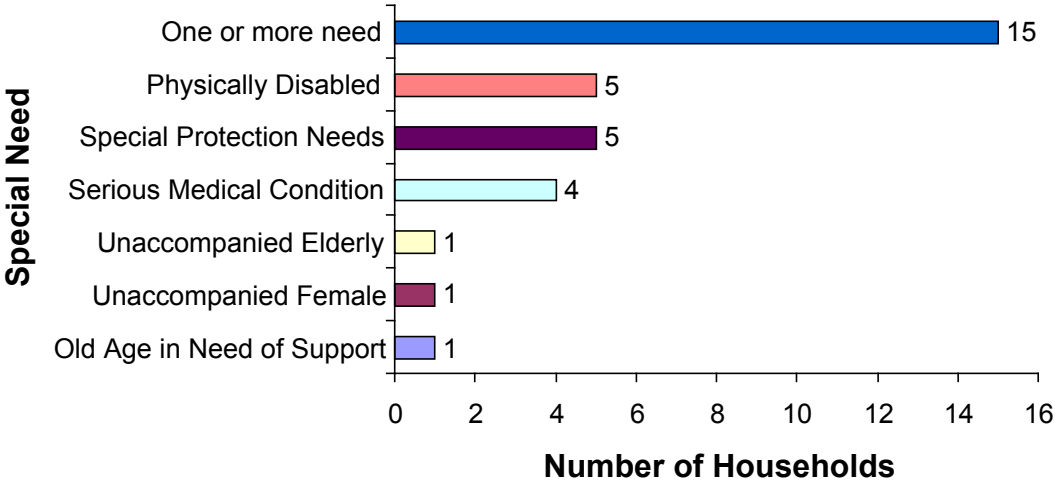


Figure 19: Main Source of Income, from Household Surveys

(Sample of 277 households which indicated their main source of income)

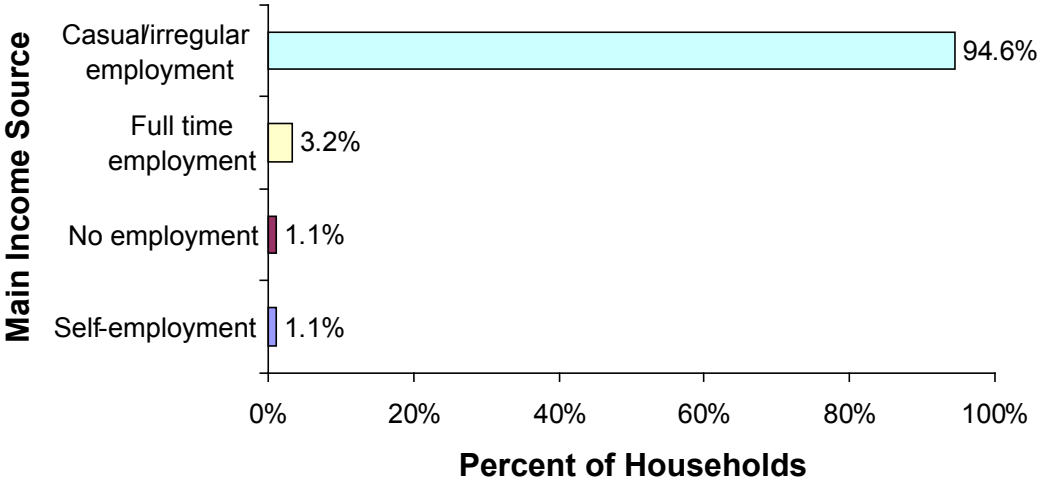


Figure 20: Economic Sectors in which Household is Employed, from Household Surveys

(Sample of 277 households which indicated their economic sector. The values do not add up to 100% because households listed up to three economic sectors.)

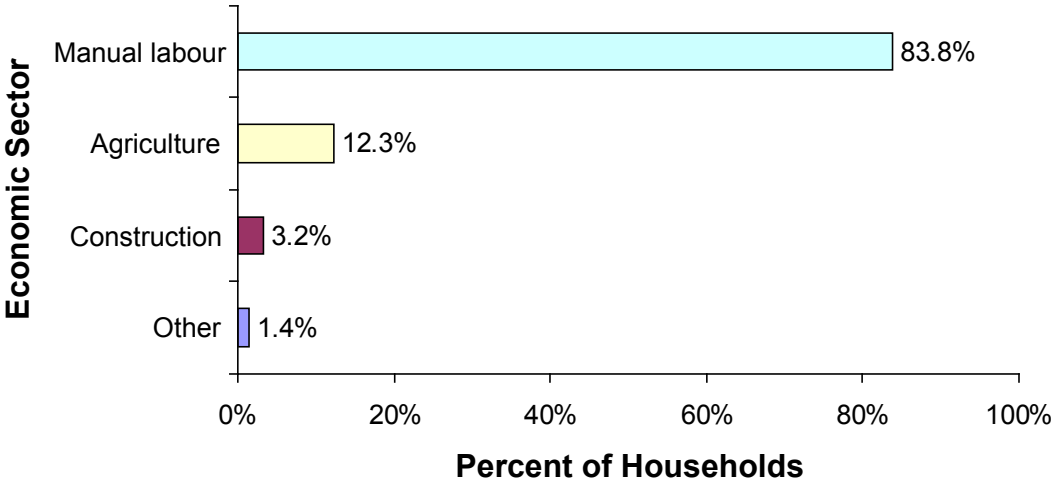


Figure 21: Top Three Priorities of Returnee/IDP Households, from Household Surveys
