

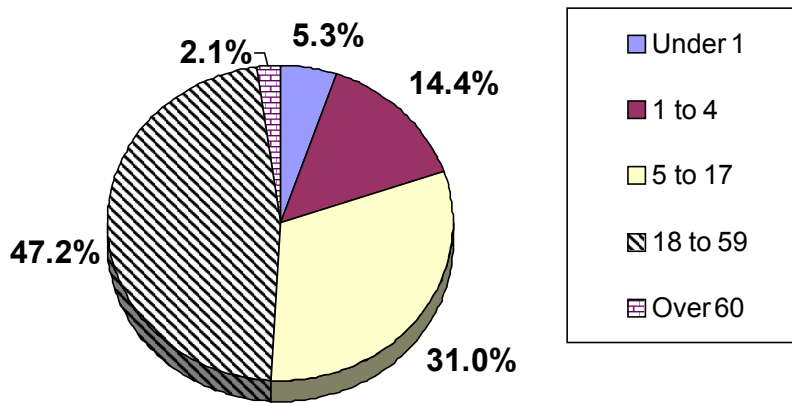

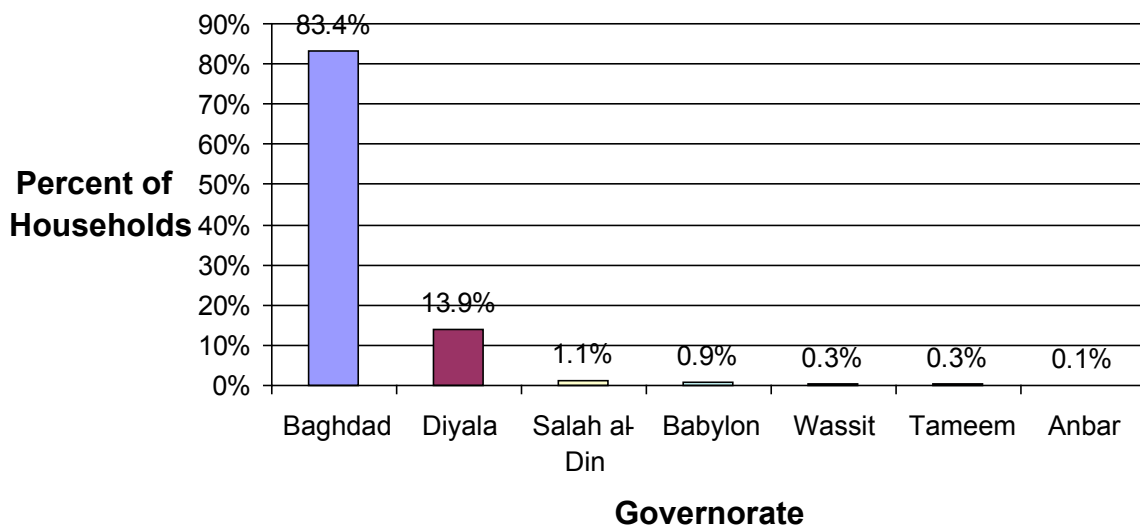
**Figure 1: Age Range of Monitored Households, from Household Surveys**

(Sample of 536 households which indicated their age range)



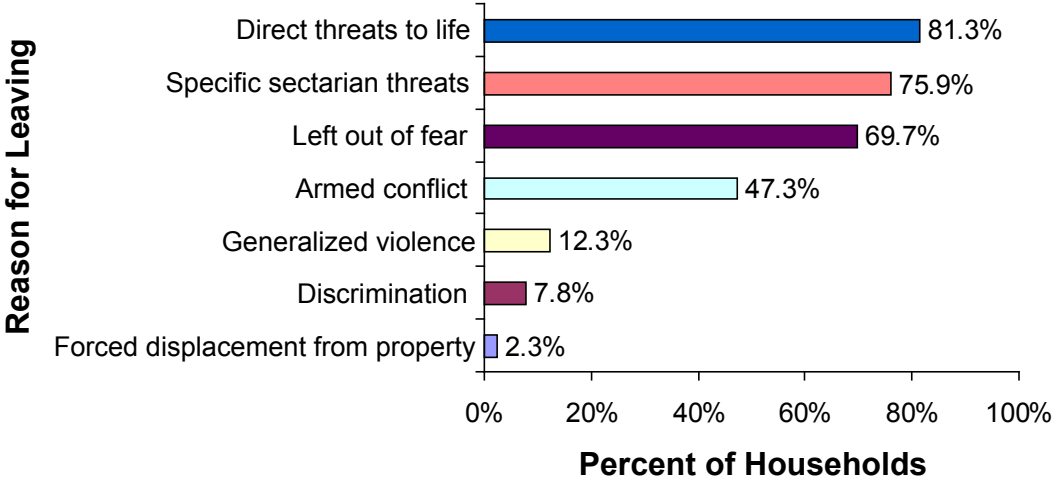
**Figure 2: Governorate Most Recently Displaced From, from Household Surveys**

(Sample of 705 households which indicated the governorate from which they were most recently displaced)



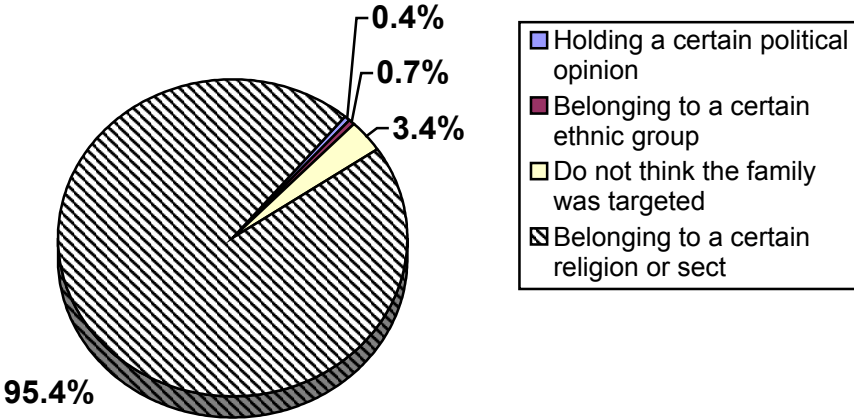
**Figure 3: Reasons for Leaving Place of Residence, based on Household Surveys**

(Sample of 706 households which indicated their reason for leaving their former place of residence. The values do not add up to 100% because households listed up to three reasons for leaving.)



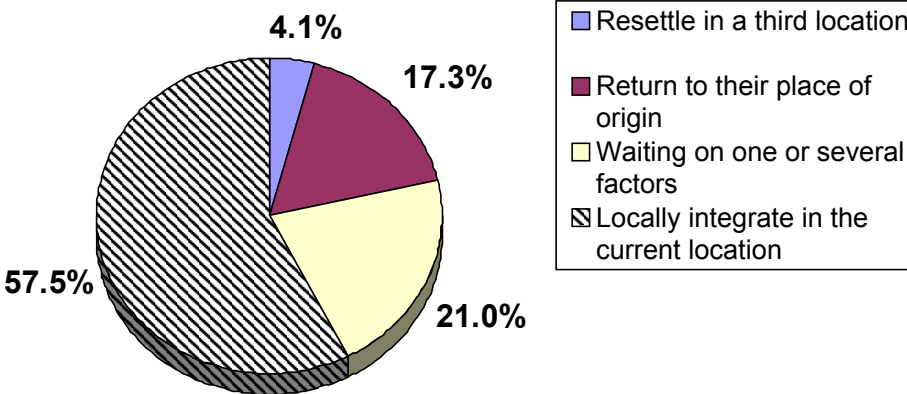
**Figure 4: Targeting of Family, from Household Surveys**

(Sample of 703 households which indicated whether they thought they were targeted)



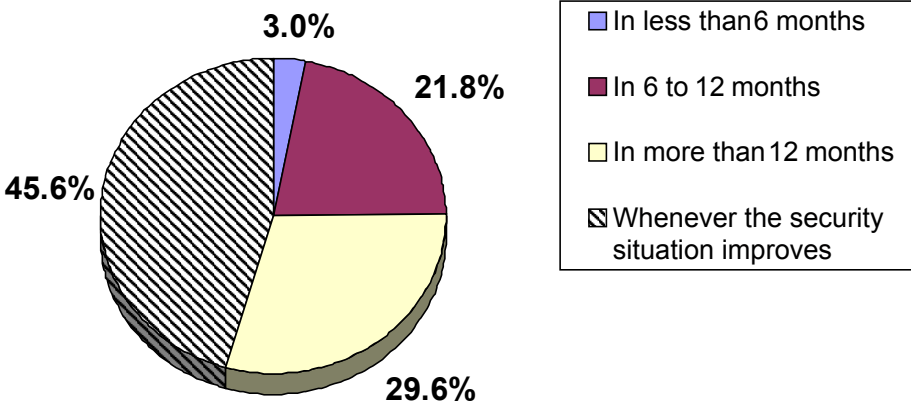
**Figure 5: IDP Intentions, from Household Surveys**

(Sample of 704 IDP households which indicated their intentions)



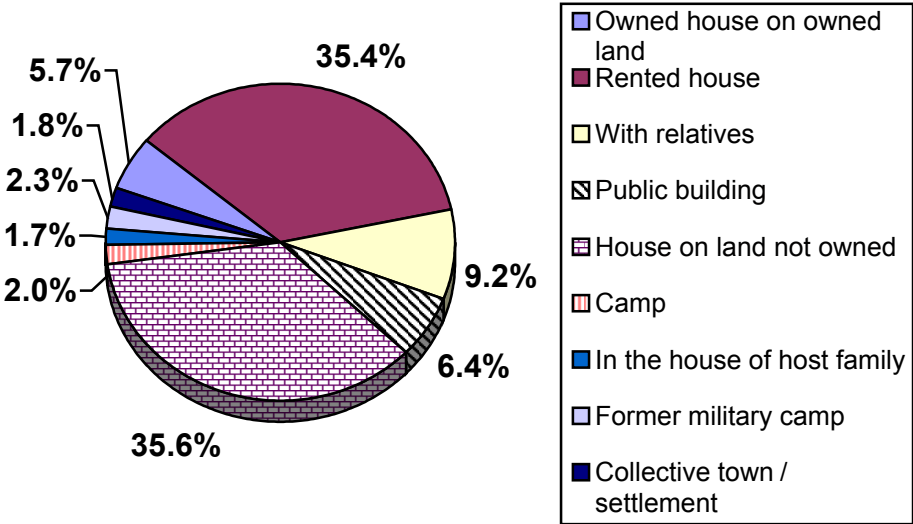
**Figure 6: When Planning to Move, from Household Surveys**

(Sample of 592 IDP households which indicated when they plan to return / integrate / resettle)



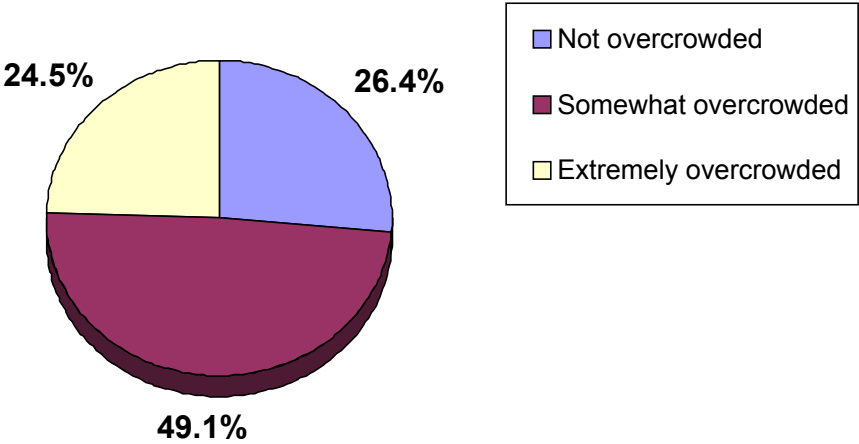
**Figure 7: Type of Accommodation, from Household Surveys**

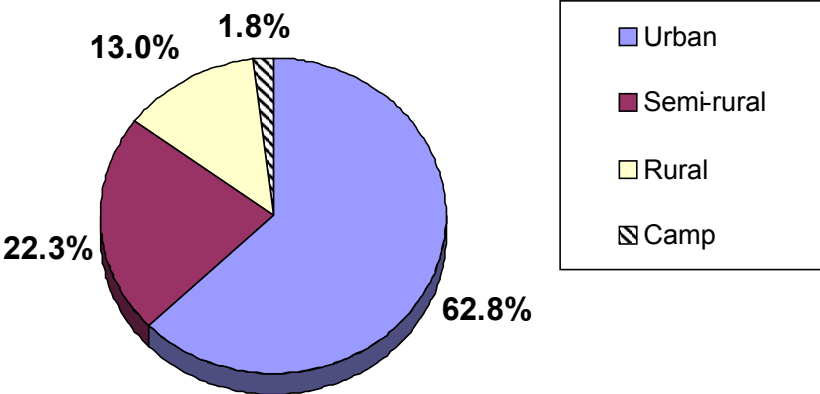
**Figure 8: Degree of Crowding in Housing, from Household Surveys**

(Sample of 705 households which indicated the degree of crowding in their housing)



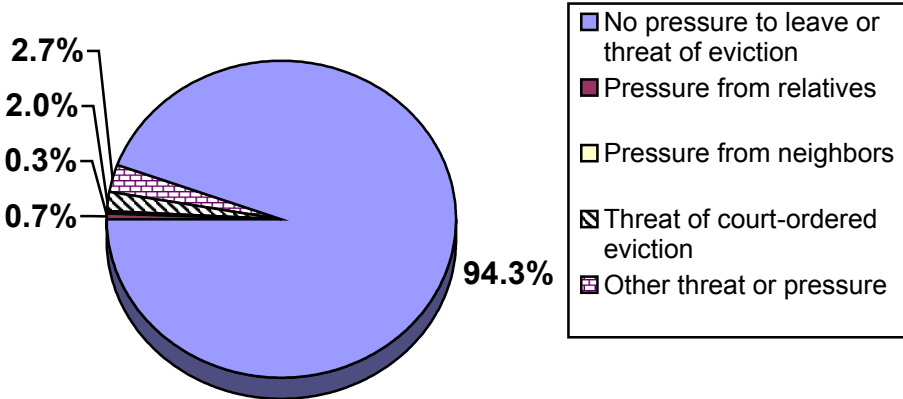
**Figure 9: Housing Location, from Household Surveys**

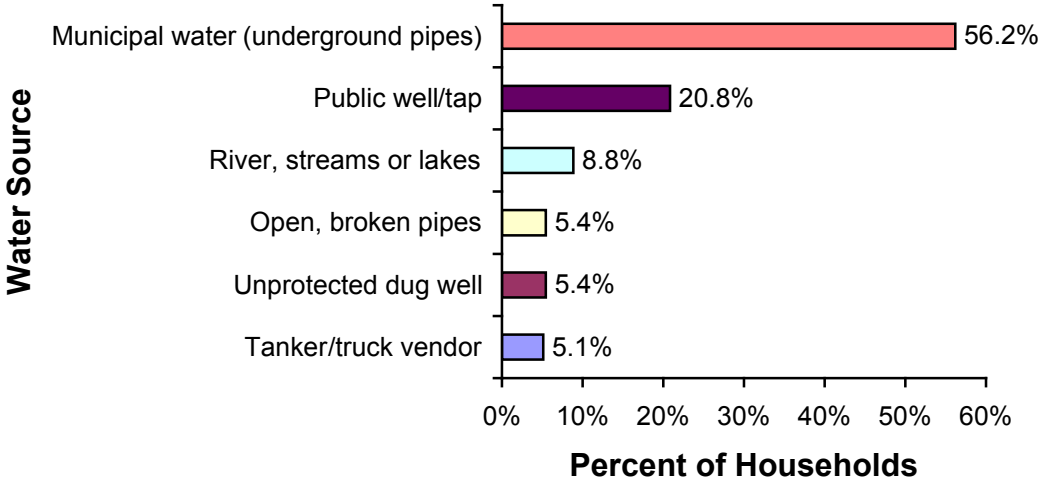
**Figure 10: Does the family currently face a threat of eviction of pressure to leave?**

(Sample of 706 households which indicated whether they faced a threat of eviction or pressure to leave)



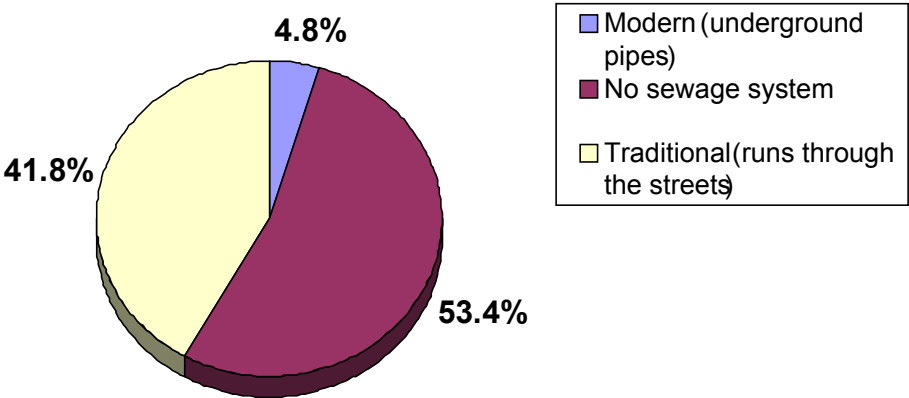
**Figure 11: Main Water Sources, based on Household Surveys**

(Sample of 701 households which indicated their main water sources. The values do not add up to 100% because households listed up to three water sources.)



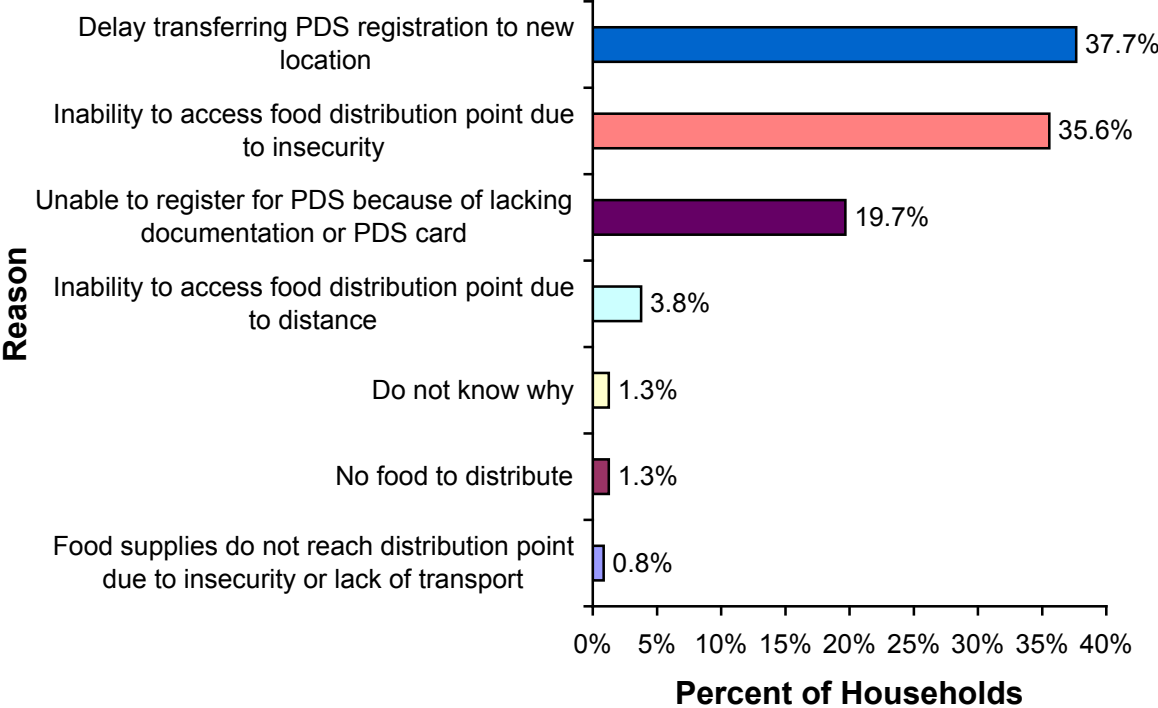
**Figure 12: Sewage System, from Household Surveys**

(Sample of 686 households which indicated whether they had a sewage system)



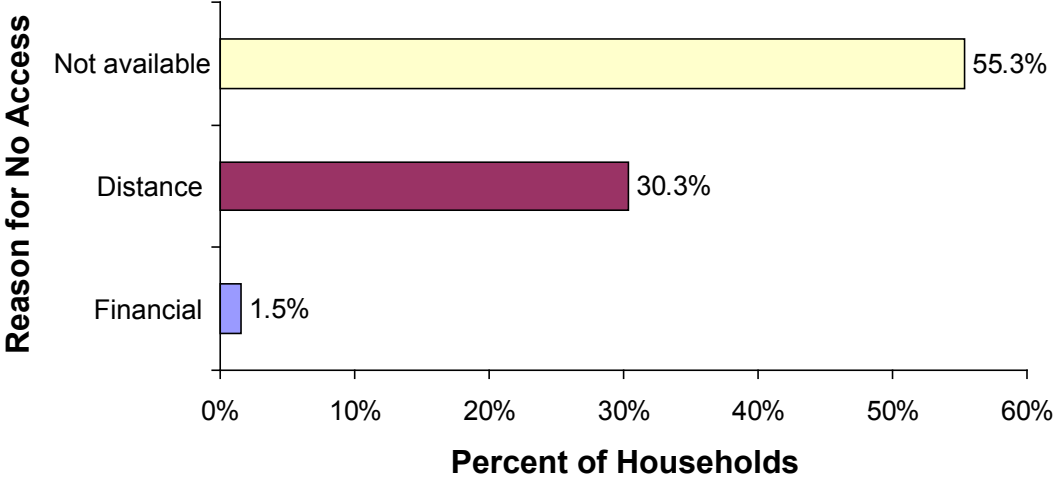
**Figure 13: Why Not Receiving PDS Rations, based on Household Surveys**

(Sample of 239 households which indicated why they did not receive PDS rations.)



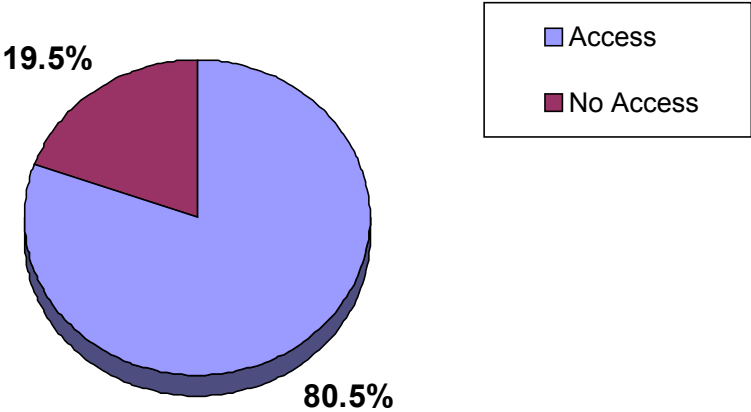
**Figure 14: Reasons for No Access to Health Facilities, from Household Surveys**

(Sample of 132 households which indicated that they had no access to health facilities. The values do not add up to 100% because not all households provided the reason for lack of access.)



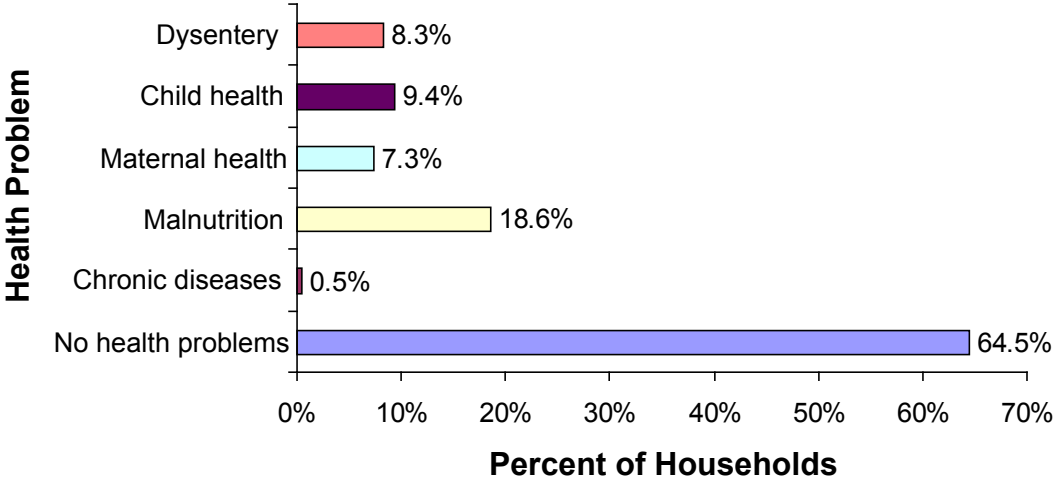
**Figure 15: Access to Primary Health Centre in Village, from Household Surveys**

(Sample of 677 households which indicated whether they had access to a primary health centre in their village)



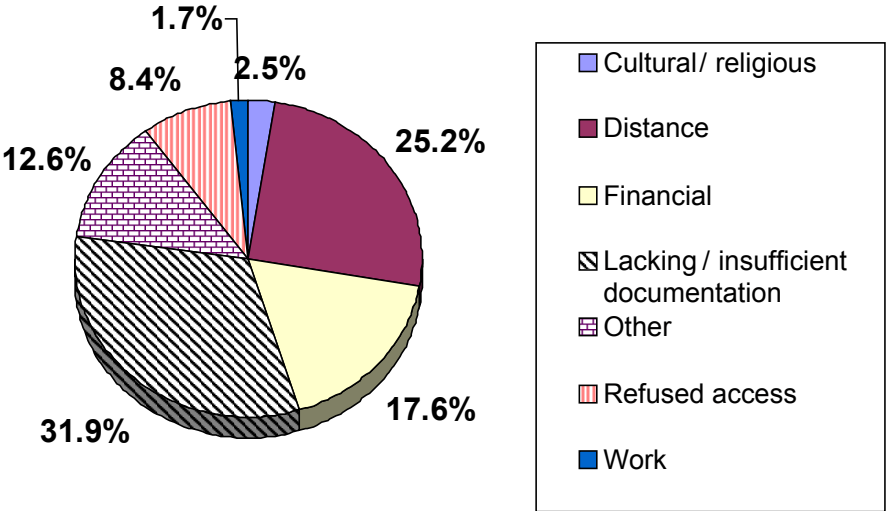
**Figure 16: Main Health Problems of Family, from Household Surveys**

(Sample of 628 households which indicated their main health problems)



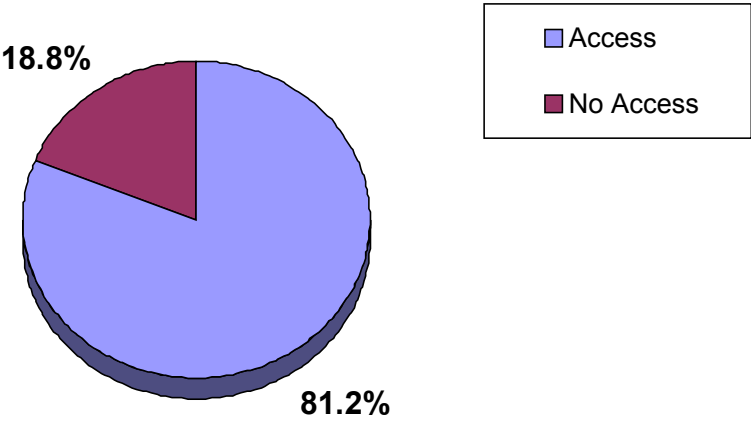
**Figure 17: Reasons for Not Attending School, from Household Surveys**

(Sample of 119 households which gave reasons for not attending school)



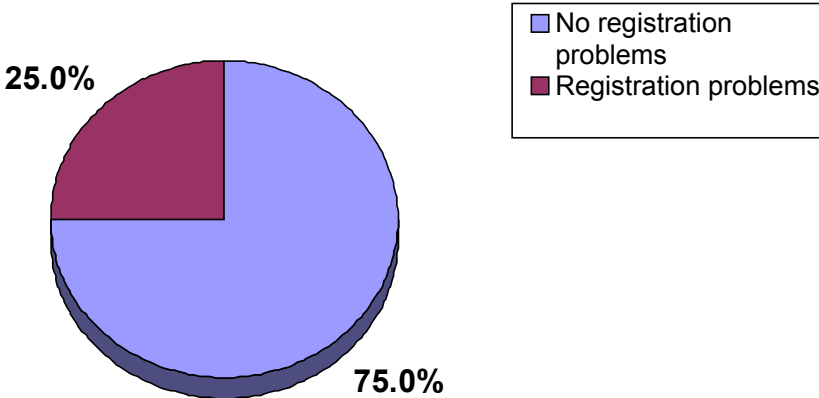
**Figure 18: Access to Education Facilities in Village, from Household Surveys**

(Sample of 479 households which indicated whether they had access to education facilities in their village)



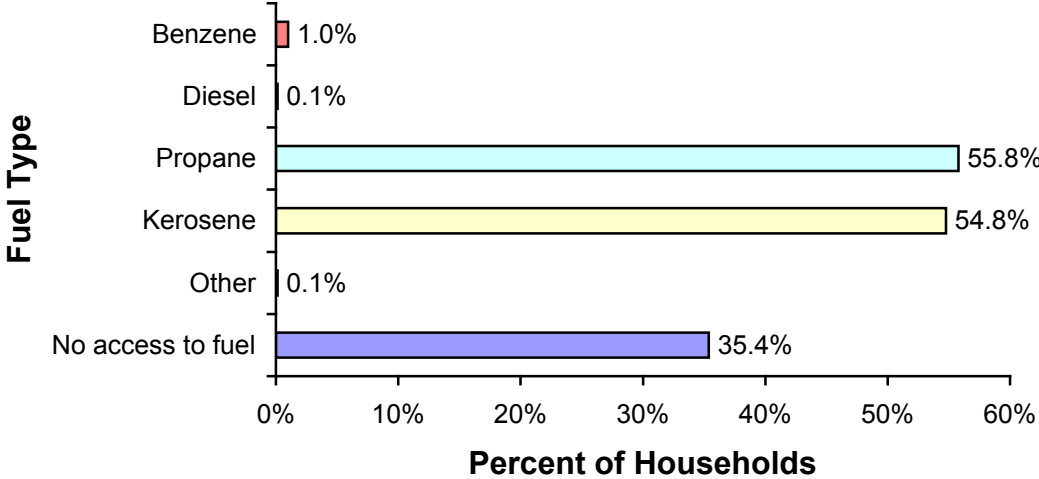
**Figure 19: Problems in Registering for Schools Because of Lack of Documentation, from Household Surveys**

(Sample of 456 households which indicated whether they had problems registering for schools because of lack of documentation)



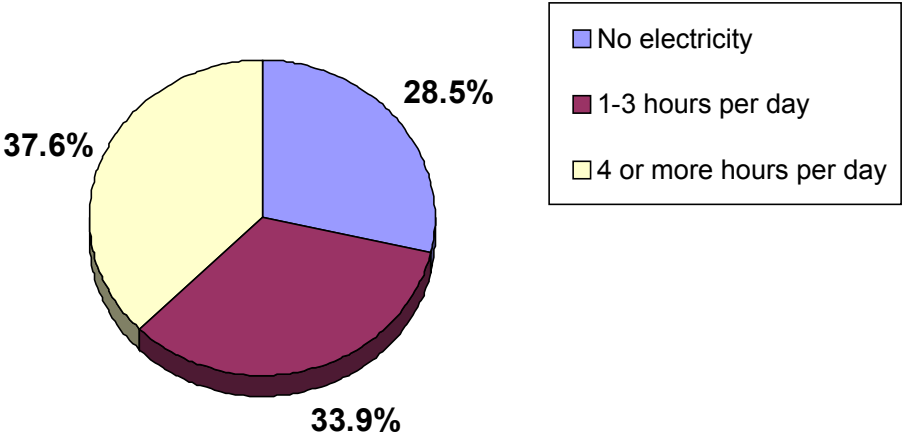
**Figure 20: Accessible Fuels, from Household Surveys**

(Sample of 701 households which indicated whether they had access to fuels)



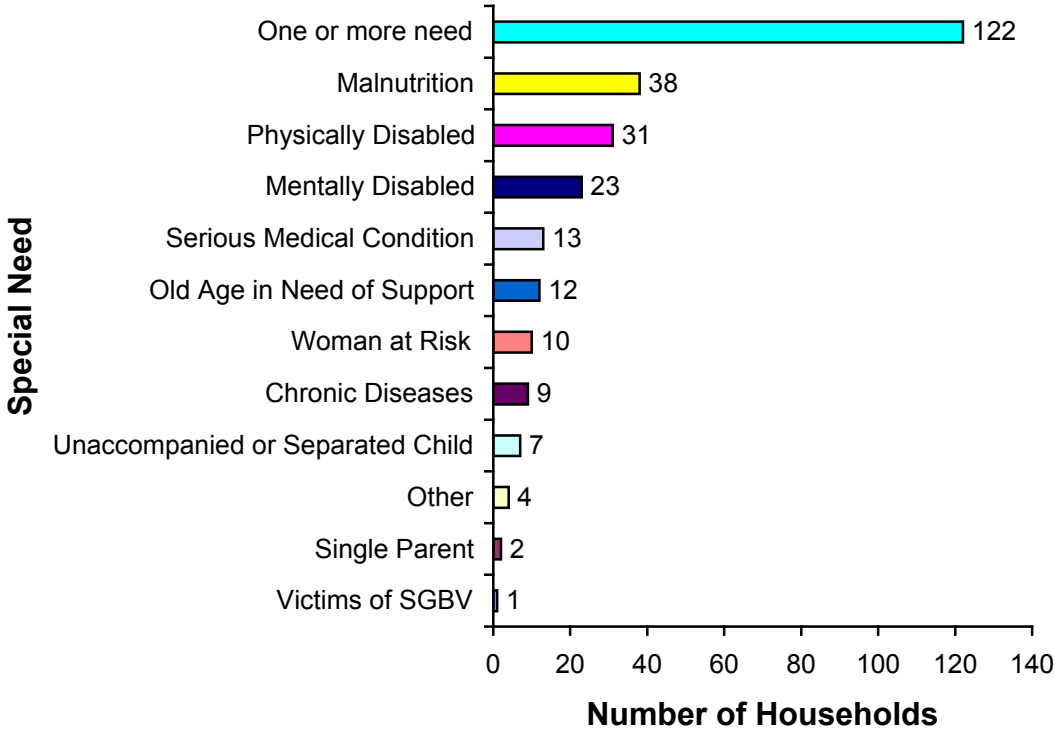
**Figure 21: Access to Electricity, from Household Surveys**

(Sample of 702 households which indicated their access to electricity)



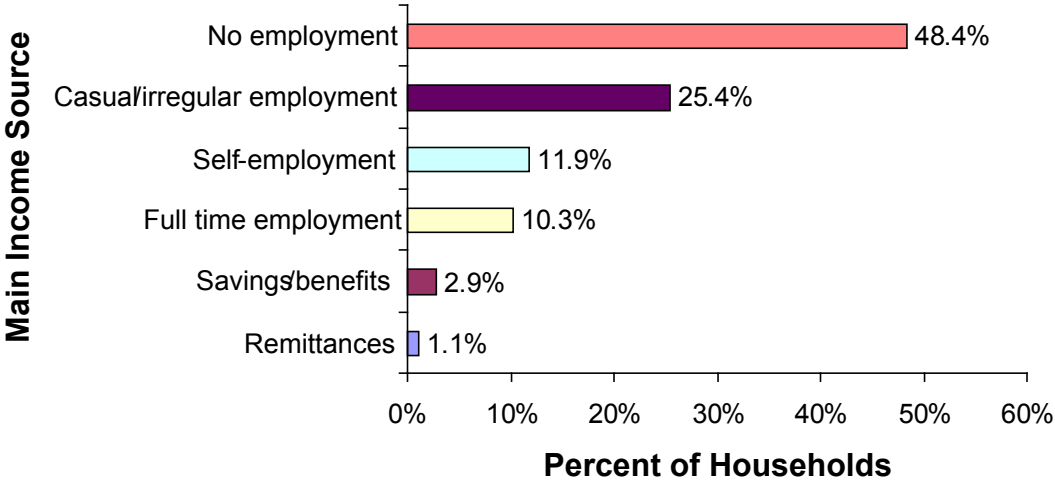
**Figure 22: Special Needs of Returnee/IDP Households, based on Household Surveys**

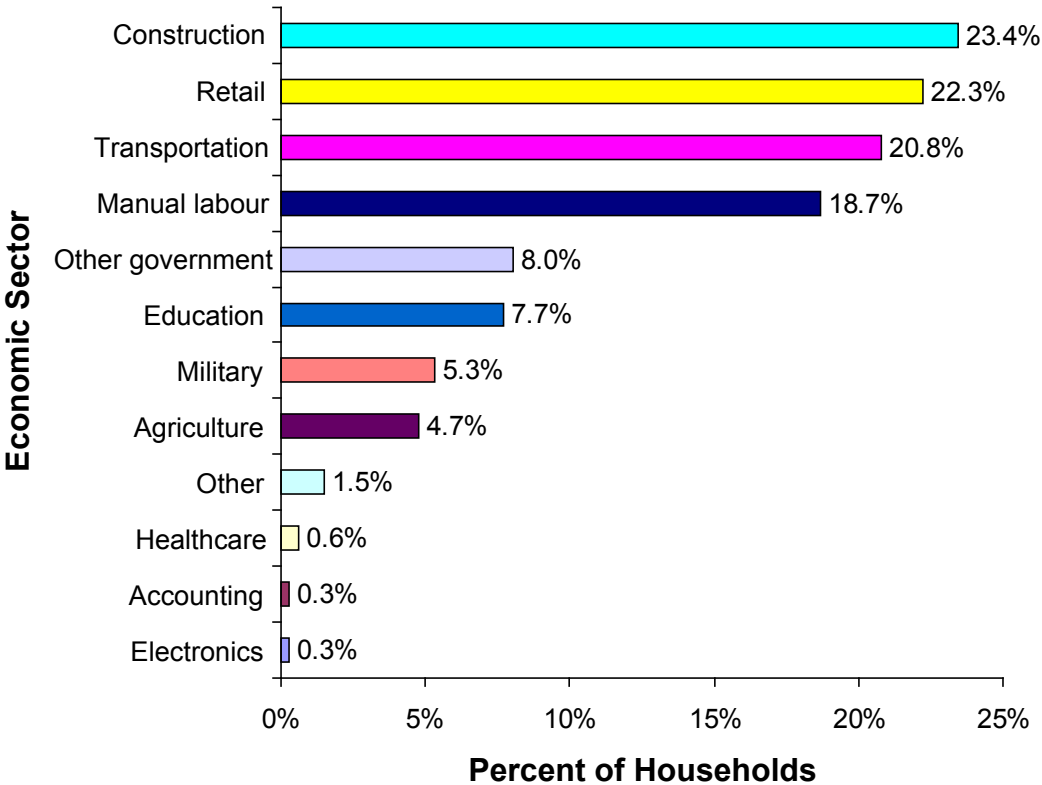
**Figure 23: Main Source of Income, from Household Surveys**
