(Sample of 602 households which indicated their country of displacement)

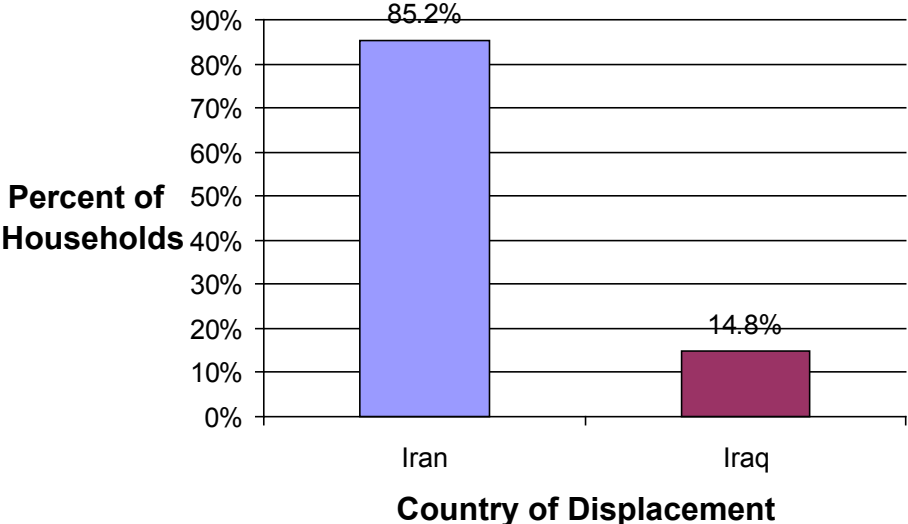


Figure 2: Return into Continued Displacement, based on Household Surveys

(Sample of 489 households which indicated their place of return)

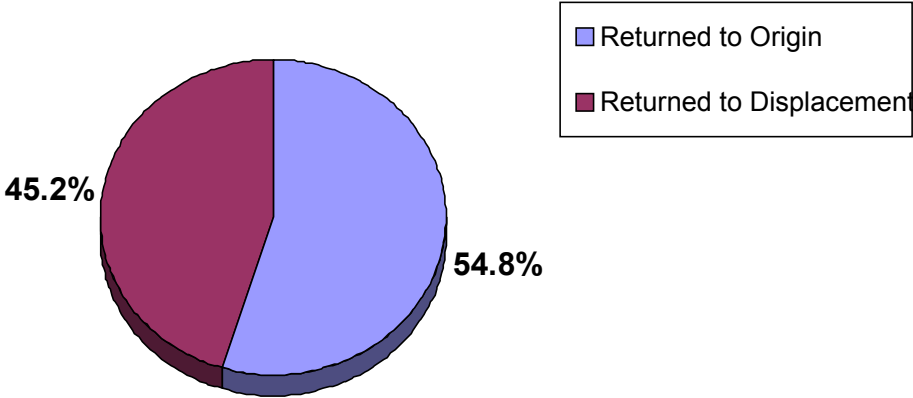


Figure 3: Types of Returnees and IDPs, from Household Surveys

(Sample of 1,646 households which indicated their origin and intentions. The IDPs listed here are not new IDPs.)

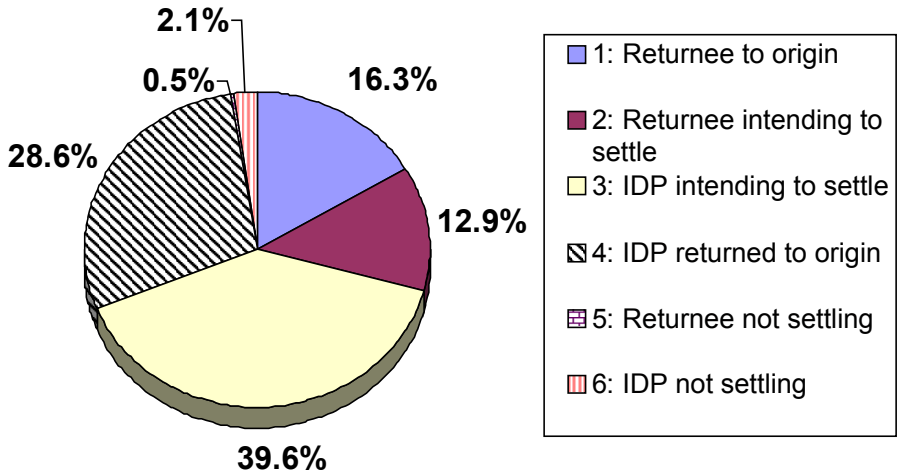


Figure 4: Age Range of Monitored Households, from Household Surveys

(Sample of 1,632 households which indicated their age range)

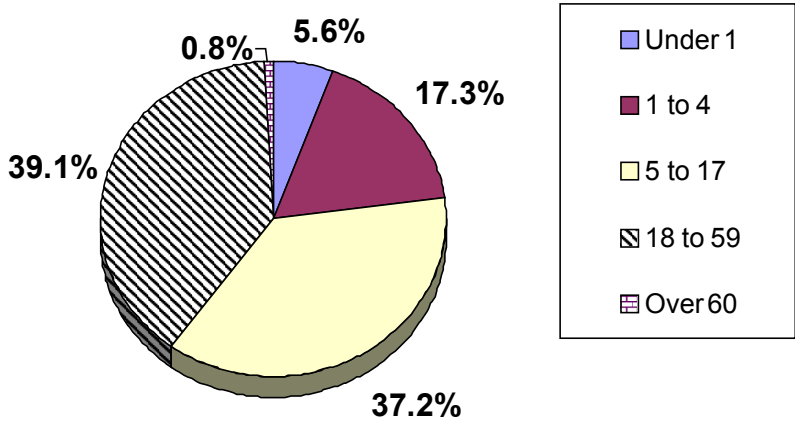


Figure 5: Gender of Returnee/IDP Family Members, from Household Surveys

(Sample of 1,635 households which indicated their family members' genders)

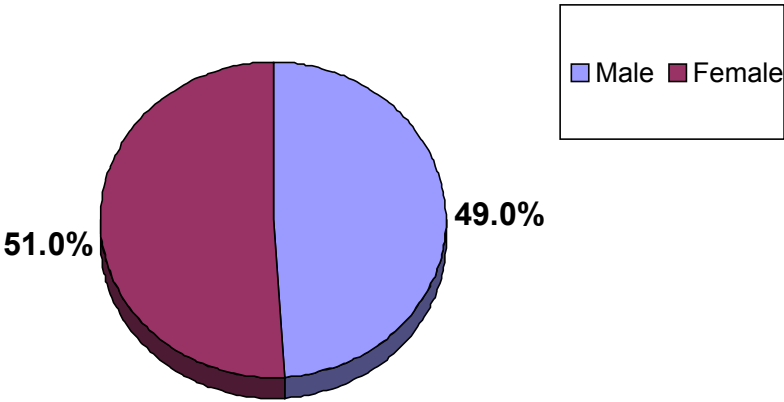


Figure 6: Reasons for Leaving, based on Household Surveys

(Sample of 1,538 households which indicated their reason for leaving their former place of residence. The values do not add up to 100% because households listed up to three reasons for leaving.)

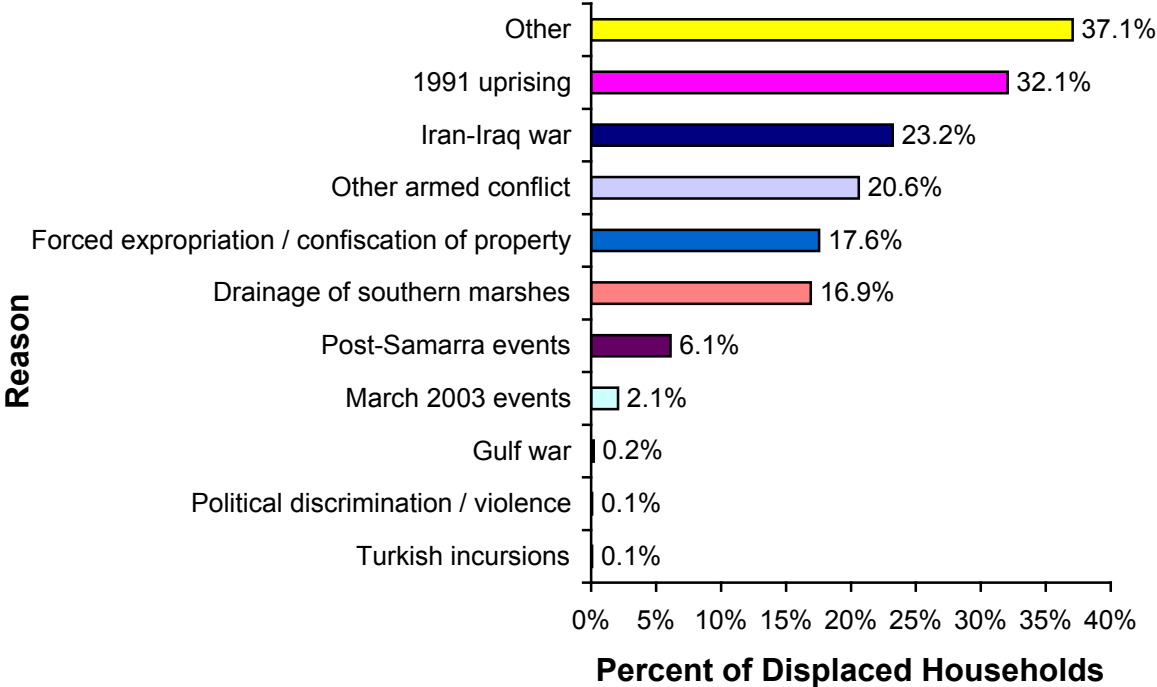


Figure 7: Reasons for Return to Iraq, based on Household Surveys

(Sample of 559 households which indicated their reasons for return to Iraq. The values do not add up to 100% because households listed up to three reasons for returning.)

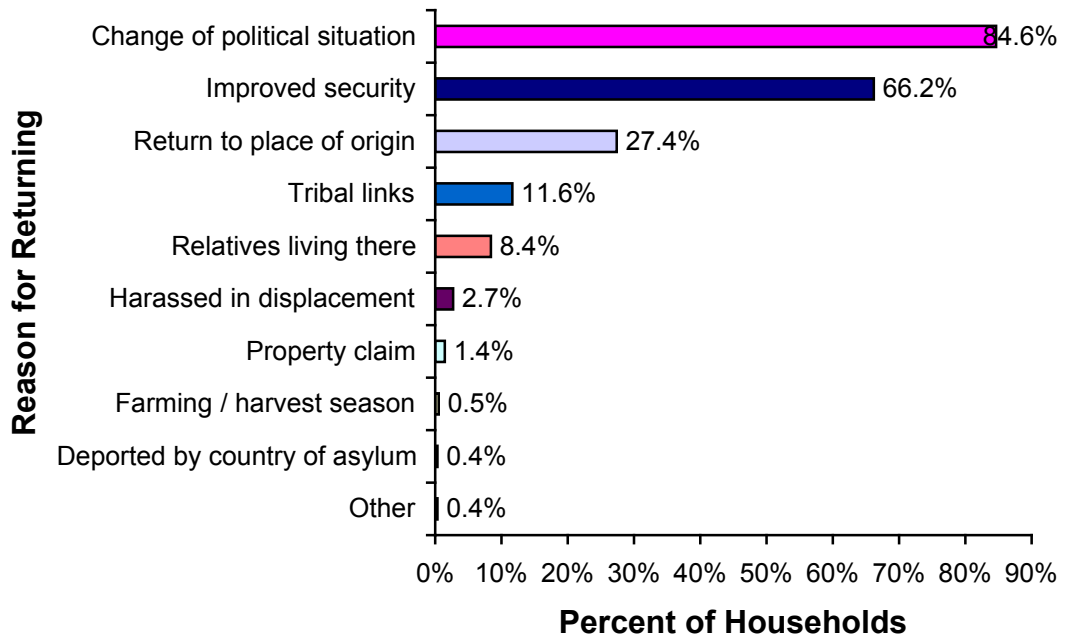


Figure 8: Year of Return to Iraq, based on Household Surveys

(Sample of 601 households which indicated their year of return)

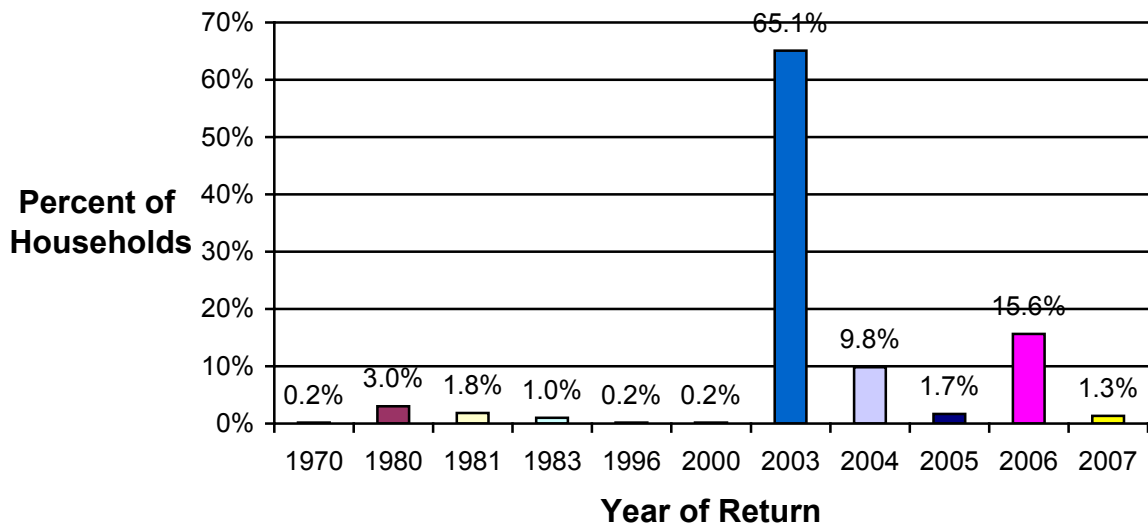


Figure 9: Type of Accommodation, from Household Surveys

(Sample of 1,633 households which indicated their housing type)

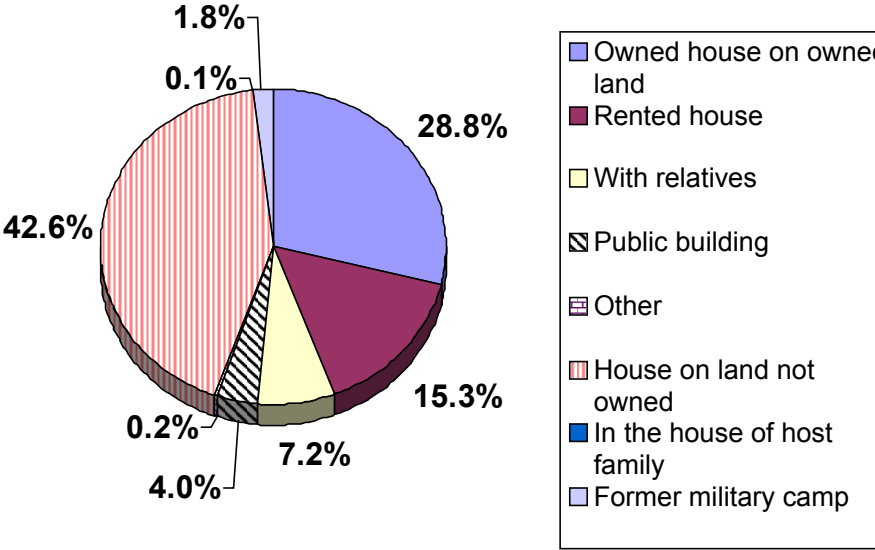


Figure 10: Households with Access to Health Facilities, from Household Surveys

(Sample of 1,607 households)

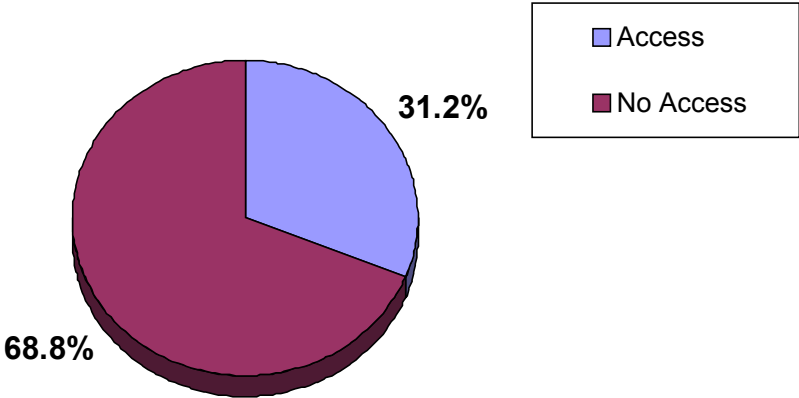


Figure 11: Reasons for No Access to Health Facilities, from Household Surveys

(Sample of 1,645 households which indicated that they had no access to health facilities. The values do not add up to 100% because not all households provided the reason for lack of access.)

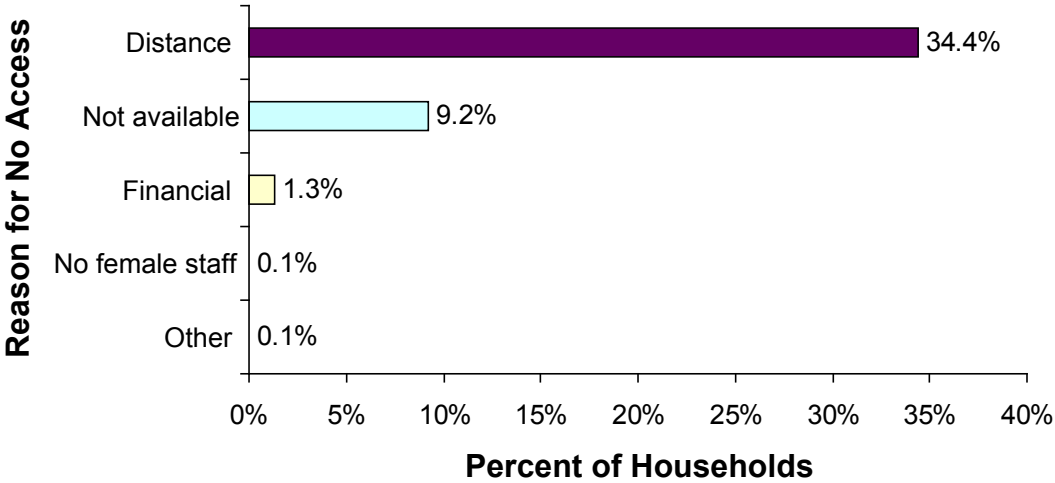


Figure 12: Reasons for Not Attending School, from Household Surveys

(Sample of 311 households which gave reasons for not attending school)

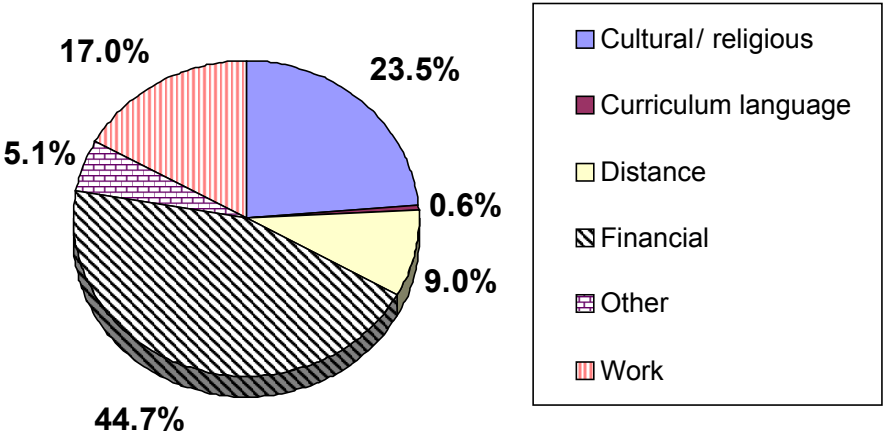


Figure 13: Documents that Monitored Returnees/IDPs had Trouble Renewing, from Household Surveys

(Sample of 1,646 households)

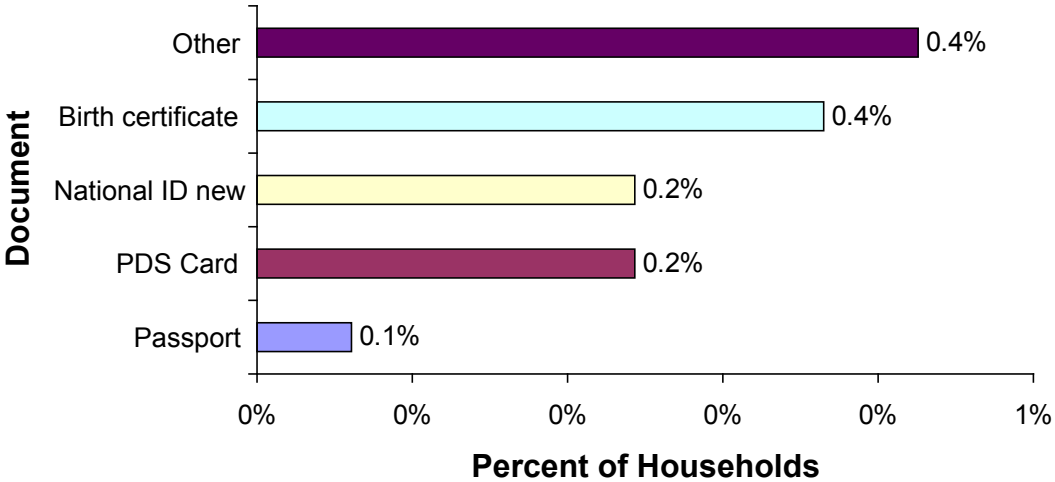


Figure 14: Special Needs of Returnee/IDP Households, based on Household Surveys

(Sample of 1,646 households)

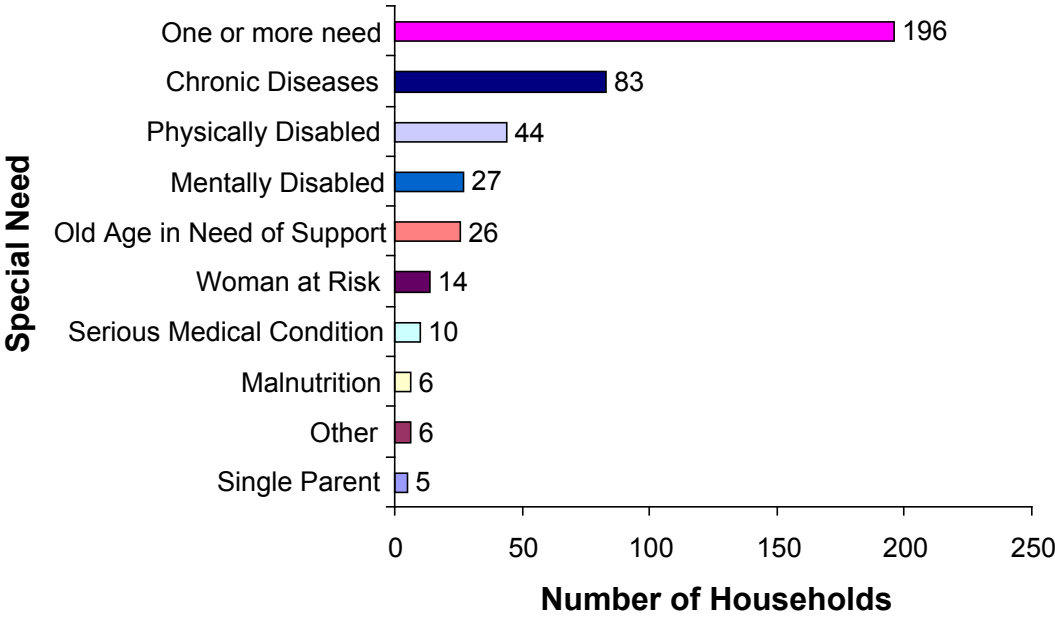


Figure 15: Main Sources of Income, from Household Surveys

(Sample of 1 households which indicated their main sources of income)

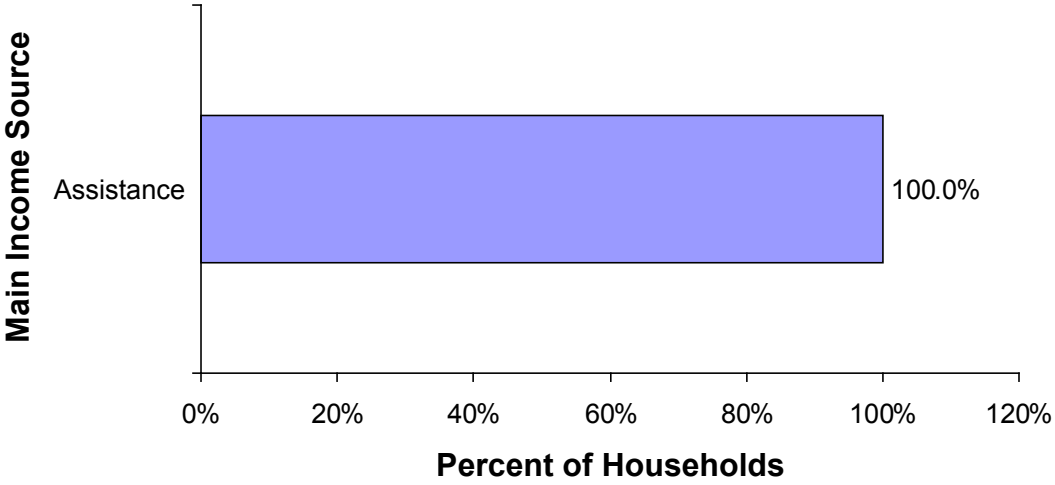


Figure 16: Top Three Priorities of Returnee/IDP Households, from Household Surveys
